St Benedict's Church, Coolmeen Sunday 9am St. Michael's Church, Kildysart Sunday 10.30am Church of Our Lady of the Wayside, Lissycasey Sunday 12noon

*Mass times in Cranny and Ballycorick change when the time changes. This new schedule will begin on the weekend of 4th-5th November, 2017 (the weekend after the time changes). In addition, weekday Mass in Kildysart will be celebrated at 9.30am from 30th October, 2017 onwards. We appreciate that this new schedule might not be convenient for everyone. However, we are glad that we will continue to have Sunday Mass celebrated in each of our five Churches. Coolmeen Ladies Football Club: have a proud tradition in the history of Ladies Football in West Clare. Four years ago the Club formed its first Mothers and Others team under the guidance of Aaron Kelly. He is currently finishing his fourth year training this team. This is a great way for women to play the sport of Ladies Gaelic Football in a fun, non-competitive and a social environment. Currently in Clare there are three such teams. Kilmihil and Fergus Rovers also field M and O's Teams. Next Saturday three Clare teams will travel to Portmarnock GAA grounds to take part in the Lidl National Gaelic 4 Mothers and Others Blitz. This was an initiative set up by the Ladies Football Association to encourage women to get their recommended weekly exercise in a fun way while meeting other women in their area. The initiative has proved hugely popular with women of all ages and is now played in all thirty two counties. Each Province organises a Blitz and the National Competition in Dublin will attract between 900 and 1000 women next weekend, the 14th of October in Naomh Mearnóg Club Grounds in Portmarnock, Dublin. Coolmeen's current panel of nineteen comprise of people who have never kicked a ball before with ladies who played Club and County level but have retired from the game for a number of years. The women started training on the first week of March training once a week and for the last six weeks have trained twice a week to prepare for their end of year Blitz. All of the team are from the Coolmeen/Cranny area and a number from the neighbouring Parish of Kildysart It is an easy way for new comers to the parish to get involved in their community and get to know people. The emphasis at training is having fun.
